Students explore the cultural heritage of Tamil and learn how Thirukkural can be applied to enhance intelligence, alongside studying the history and evolution of Tamil prose. The curriculum features seminal literary works like Kamba Ramayanam, Silapathikaram, Sivagasindhamani, and Periyapuranam. In the second year, students delve into ancient Tamil poetic collections such as Patthupattu and Ettuthogai, while also studying the life and contributions of King Rajaraja Chola through drama. In the English curriculum, significant works include The Dance of Shiva by Ananda Coomaraswamy, Hayavadana by Girish Karnad, and the short story Draupadi by Mahasweta Devi. Bharathiar University's syllabus further enhances cultural awareness by incorporating works of various Indian writers, enabling students to gain profound insights into India's rich literary and cultural heritage. To promote linguistic diversity, Indian languages like Tamil, Malayalam, and Hindi are offered as Part I in the undergraduate programs. Classroom instruction is often bilingual, conducted in both Tamil and English, ensuring inclusivity and deeper understanding. The institution regularly organizes programs on yoga awareness, meditation, self-defense, food culture, and moral values. Yoga is a mandatory part of the curriculum, with students undertaking a yoga course in their second year. Celebrations of traditional festivals such as Pongal, Navaratri, Onam, Ramzan, and Christmas foster unity and appreciation for India's cultural diversity. To manage liquid waste, the college treats approximately 1,50,000 liters of domestic effluent daily, recycling the treated water for irrigation purposes. In addition, waste generated in science laboratories is carefully decontaminated to ensure the safe disposal of chemicals.

Biomedical waste is separated at its source and disposed of following strict safety protocols, ensuring compliance with local regulations.
